Dr. Levine describes herself as a "Yankee Jewish feminist who teaches in a predominantly Christian divinity school in the buckle of the Bible belt." Her scholarship is combined with a commitment to eliminating anti-Jewish, racist, sexist and homophobic theologies.

Elliot Chodoff is a political and military analyst specializing in the Middle East conflict and the global war on terrorism. He is a major in the IDF reserves and a graduate of the Home Front Command Senior Commanders Course. He presently serves as the Commanding Officer of the Population Behavior and Information Unit of the Northern Region in IDF Home Front Command. In addition, he is an expert in infantry weapons and tactics, and has taught courses in fieldcraft and small unit tactics to infantry and paratroop officers. He received the IDF Home Front Command Outstanding Officer Award in 2006.

Elliot has presented and published papers on the subjects of Deterrence and U.S. Military Manpower Policy, Cultural Relativism and Nuclear Deterrence Policy in the Middle East, Israel's Changing Defense Posture Following the 1982 Invasion of Lebanon, Terrorists' Use of Modern Information Technology, and Regional Deterrence During and After the Cold War. His paper on Combat Motivation and Effectiveness in Infantry Units has been on the recommended reading list at the U.S. Army War College. His articles have appeared in *The Washington Times, National Post of Canada, In the National Interest, Front Page Magazine*, and numerous web journals. Elliot is the founder and senior editor of *MidEast On Target*, an e-journal and newsletter.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Even though we come from many different places, one of the wonderful things about our community is that we are a very cohesive group, and we care for one another regardless of what our background is. We have varying degrees of religious backgrounds, and some none at all. Among us we can find differences in interests, differences in domestic politics, and differences in how we view world events. But what is important is that we are all working towards the same goal. We are taking responsibility and working for the betterment of our local, national, and international communities. We may take different approaches, but we are all going in the same direction. That is how I view, and I hope you view, our local Federation. Just as we strive to be a cohesive and caring group towards one another, the Jewish Federation of Springfield helps coordinate these desires through its various local activities. Federation also helps us achieve this same cohesiveness and caring for communities around the world. We don't have to be united in opinions, but as long as we are united in these goals we will continue to be a community far more successful than our numbers would imply. In this, our 75th anniversary year, I hope that each of you will find a way that you can contribute to and through Federation to help us continue our community's long and impressive history.

From the Springfield Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC)



SAGE NOTES



We start and end the summer season with community-wide and public presentations, especially befitting our Federation's celebration of 75 years of Community & Commitment. In June, just as the Education and Culture Committee's Third Annual Film Festival ended, the Cardozo Society brought noted law Professor John Q Barrett, who offered insight on how the Nuremberg trials apply to today's

world. In August, Springfield's Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) outreach to and nearly two year partnership with the Great Rivers Presbytery will result in bringing renowned Bible scholar Professor Amy-Jill Levine to Springfield. Nestled in between, Louis Davidson will present a slide presentation of historic synagogues (July 10) and Elliot Chodoff, political and military analyst, will present a Middle East update (July 25) with thanks to Education and Culture Committee and JCRC respectively. These are in addition to our monthly Chaverim and Knosh & Knowledge programs sponsored by the Senior Committee.

I feel very fortunate and appreciate the opportunity to join with colleagues and volunteers from Federations throughout the country on this year's campaigner's mission to Paris, France and Israel. The Paris itinerary emphasizes how the Federation movement assists the French Jewish community, which lives with anti-Semitism and with acts and threats of terrorism. In addition, we'll see social services and programs we help fund for those in need in Paris and in Israel. This is a working mission with major campaign training and skill building components. Jewish Federations of North America believes so strongly in the importance of experiencing Federation's work first-hand, that they provided a \$3,600 subsidy for this mission. This includes a special \$1,800 subsidy for small Federation executive directors. I find it sad and ironic that while we are celebrating our 75th Anniversary year, anti-Semitism is on the rise in France and in Europe as are threats of terror. The mission starts off in Paris the day after the Soccer World Cup ends. I look forward to coming home and sharing my thoughts and experiences about the mission with you.

This summer's robust activities reflect our community's 75 year legacy and commitment to our mission: to serve the Jewish people locally, in Israel and throughout the world through coordinated fund raising, community-wide programming, social services and educational activities. I thank all of you for everything you do to help make all of this possible.
