HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2015-2016 YEAR PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



It has been a privilege to serve as the President of the Jewish Federation of Springfield for the past two years. I could not have filled this role without the support of the staff and the Federation Board of Directors. We had an engaged and active board, which is a key to maintaining a strong organization. **Carol Loewenstein** will be ending her term of board service at the 2016 annual meeting, and I appreciate that she was willing to fill this role after her past service to Federation. I have worked closely with incoming president **Barry Seidman**, and know that he has a strong commitment to the Federation and is well prepared to be our next president.

During the past year we had challenges in our local office due to the resignation of program director, **Rachel Hinkle**, and soon after, the resignation of executive director, **Jo Gon**. Happily, office manager, **Wendy Evans-Terry** has been a steadfast source of continuity and institutional knowledge. **Sari Miller Wancket**, our social worker, has continued to be available as-needed to assist members of our community. We welcomed **Linda Morrison** as our new program director in August, and **Nancy Sage** began as our new executive director in December. I am thankful for their dedicated service in support of our Jewish community. In the midst of all this change, **Mark Wancket** has been a strong leader for our annual campaign, and with his commitment and persistence we continue to move closer to this year's goal.

But the key to having a strong organization is the membership, and we live in a wonderful small Jewish community. From rallying to raise funds for those at risk in Israel during the Stop the Sirens appeal to doing hands on work at the JCRC Mitzvah

Mobile Food Pantry, our community members demonstrated their willingness to act. Participating in communal activities reinforces our commitment and actualizes Jewish values. I want to especially thank those who volunteer behind the scenes for Federation-from Chaverim volunteers who provide transportation and periodic home visits, to campaign solicitors, to Education and Culture committee members who screen films for our summer festival. All the volunteer hours help to create our Federation.

I hope that I have also helped us to look ahead as we enter our 75th year of service. After attending the Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) General Assembly in 2014, I realized that we needed to be actively planning for the future of our Jewish community. Our relationship with JFNA has led to our participation in the LIFE & LEGACY™ grant, and we have eagerly accepted the challenge to become more active in securing a financial future for the Federation and our congregations. I am anticipating that the LIFE & LEGACY™ committee members will be more involved as we move into the summer months. I have also strongly encouraged the decision of our congregations to form a committee to consider future options, and Federation will be adding representatives to their committee and helping to secure a facilitator.

I hope you will take the time to read the committee reports in this annual report to the community. This is an exciting and challenging time as we look ahead to another decade of service to the Springfield Jewish Community. Thank you for your ongoing commitment and investment in the work of the Federation.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The Jewish Federation of Springfield may be considered a “small Federation,” but our strength over the past 75 years has been due to our dedication to protecting and enhancing the well-being of Jews in Israel, throughout the world, and serving the interests and needs of our own local Jewish community. Our priorities and activities remain true to our

mission, and your generosity makes it all possible. We are grateful.

I’ve had the privilege of serving as executive director for the past five months. I applied for the position because I believe so strongly in this organization, its ability to make a difference in people’s lives, and the importance of Israel to the Jewish people, and I care deeply about our community and our future. The more I learn about how our Federation functions and what we achieve, the more I understand why the Jewish Federation of Springfield has earned the reputation of being one of the most active, vibrant, and relevant small federations.

During this year of change, we have accomplished much. Our Federation gave a \$3,200 grant to B’rit Ysrael religious school, scholarships to Jewish camps, and for the first time, to the Maccabi Games. We sponsored a Jewish Film Festival, featured speakers, reshaped Chaverim, delivered holiday baskets as part of home visits, offered monthly programs for active retirees, raised funds and had fun at the Chai Tea, and the annual Gala Winetasting Event, hosted by **Ted and Pam LeBlang**.

This year has also been a year when we recognized and set out to meet the challenges we face as a community that is becoming smaller. It is a credit to our community that the Jewish Federation of Springfield was selected by the Harold Grinspoon Foundation to participate in their LIFE & LEGACY™ program. LIFE & LEGACY™ is a two year program that assists communities, through partnerships with Jewish Federations, to promote after lifetime giving to benefit local synagogues and organizations. The Federation, Temple B’rith Sholom, and Temple Israel are committed to working together to secure a Jewish future in Springfield.

The Jewish Community Relations Council led by **Natalie Silverman**, created a forum to discuss the Iran Agreement, brought to our attention issues related to Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS), kept Israel in the forefront, joined in partnership with Great Rivers Presbytery, sponsored a candidates forum, and will again work to combat hunger in Springfield through the JCRC Mitzvah Mobile Food Pantry.

Mark Wancket has been an exemplary and tireless campaign chair whose achievements include initiating a matching campaign gift increase program that contributed to the success of the 2016 campaign. A special thanks to Campaign Cabinet Advisory Committee, **Nancy Chesley** and **Cary Israel**, and to **Jack and Rita Victor** for so graciously hosting the Pacesetters event.

Every day, I am thankful that I am not alone nor could I succeed without the help, talent, support and dedication of so many. I am indebted to President **Anne Morgan** for her wise advice, counsel, and direction. Federation committees kept an amazing pace and produced a variety of programs that ranged from educational to entertaining. Our Legacy Board chaired by **Jerry Jennings** led the way long before LIFE & LEGACY in securing after life gifts and special endowments. We are grateful that the **Linda and Les Eastep Financial Needs Assistance Fund** and **Sam & Peggy Klein Fund** have been established. The Board of Directors and Executive Board are true guardians of the Federation and this community; their stewardship and dedication are behind every action we take.

The Federation office ran seamlessly due to **Wendy Evans-Terry**, office manager, who goes above and beyond the expectations of her position. Her knowledge of all things Federation, skills as a publisher, and willingness to help and offer guidance in all areas contributed greatly to ensuring a transition as smooth as possible. As always, **Sari Miller Wancket** responds with compassion and understanding when someone in our community is in need of social services. My predecessor, **Josephine Gon**, and **Rachel Hinkle**, former program director, left plans in place and tools to use so that we were able to continue the work of our Federation and serve our community. In August 2015, **Linda Morrisison** became Federation’s program director. Linda adds enthusiasm, warmth, and insight to each program and committee meeting that she plans and coordinates.

As this year comes to a close and as we begin to honor and celebrate the 75 year history of our truly remarkable organization, I want to emphasize that *our achievements are all made possible by you, and that what we do as a Federation is all about Community & Commitment.*

2016 CAMPAIGN IN REVIEW

“Do Good Everywhere, from Anywhere” was this year’s Annual Campaign theme. Your donation made this a reality as it enabled our Federation to support our local community and Jewish communities worldwide. Our Federation offers programs and services that educate, entertain, and strengthen our community. Your contribution supports special events and speakers, programs for seniors, the annual film festival, grants to the B’rit Yisrael Religious School, social services, activities of the Jewish Community Relations Council and much more. Our Federation board and staff work extremely hard to maximize the impact of your valuable donations.

Your gifts also reach far beyond the Springfield area. Last July, I had an extraordinary opportunity to witness this first-hand as I joined Jo Gon (our former Executive Director) and over 100 Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) staff and volunteers on a mission to Georgia and Israel.

In Georgia (a former part of the Soviet Union), we saw an active Jewish community that faces many needs and challenges. We were able to participate in the delivery of much needed food and services to Jews in the capital city of Tbilisi. In Israel, our visits to Beersheba and a kibbutz adjacent to Gaza allowed us to see the impact of our Federation dollars during the previous summer when the area was assaulted by missile strikes. These experiences illustrated just a small part of the “Good” Federation does around the world.

The campaign goal for 2016 was set at \$275,000 – the same amount as the previous year. This goal acknowledged several factors such as the passing of community members, migrations from the area and other financial challenges. Fortunately, many new supporters and generous donor increases enabled us to approach the goal. To date, contributions total \$265,036.50.

At the October Pacesetter event, we were privileged to have Masha Shumatskaya present “*The Crisis in Ukraine: A Personal Story.*” Only in her

mid-20’s, Masha is a refugee from her hometown of Donetsk in the Ukraine. She, along with other Jews, fled the pro-Russian rebel-controlled areas of the Ukraine which have been in conflict since the outbreak of war in 2013. But despite many risks, she continues her efforts to help other refugees less fortunate than her.

At the November Annual Campaign event, I joined Jo Gon in discussing our previously described trip to Tbilisi, Georgia and Israel. The event also provided community members an opportunity to thank and honor Jo as she left Springfield to join another Federation in south Florida. At this well attended function, Federation supporters responded generously to a first-time, matching funds challenge.

Those events and other campaign activities, such as Super Sunday, were only possible because volunteers provided their energy and numerous talents. On behalf of the Federation and the Jewish community, I recognize and appreciate the hard work and efforts of **Nancy Chesley** and **Cary Israel** who joined me as members of the Campaign Cabinet. In addition to their fundraising efforts, both helped plan and execute the Pacesetter and Annual Campaign events. A sincere thank you is extended to **Jack** and **Rita Victor** who hosted the Pacesetter Event.

The Federation acknowledges and thanks the many individuals who made calls on Super Sunday and contributed to campaign efforts throughout the year. I cannot thank **Jo Gon** and **Wendy Evans-Terry** enough for all they have done for our Federation. And the same is true for **Nancy Sage** and **Linda Morrison** who recently transitioned from being dedicated volunteers to becoming hard-working and committed professional staff.

Again, I am grateful to all who support our Annual Campaign. You truly helped achieve our ongoing goal to “Do Good Everywhere, from Anywhere.”

The Legacy remains an important part of the Federation as the years go by. It serves as a reserve for local or worldwide emergencies, and a funding source for the annual budget of the General Fund which pays for all of our programs and day to day operations.

As of December 31, 2015, the Fund had assets of \$1,190,357 contained in several named funds, the largest of which is the Hexter Fund, valued at \$810,612. The Legacy Fund was started based upon a very generous contribution made years ago by Fred Hexter from Ashland. Over the years many individuals have made donations, and others have already made provisions in their wills for the Legacy Fund.

We would like to talk and/or provide information to anyone interested in setting up their own named fund, or who would consider making a provision for the Federation in their estate planning.

I sincerely believe this would be a worthwhile investment in the future of the local, national and worldwide Jewish communities.

Most of our funds are invested with the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Chicago which has over \$900 million under management. This allows us to participate in a very diversified and well managed portfolio. We receive quarterly reports followed by phone conference reports by the managers, at which time we can ask questions.

This year we were thrilled and grateful for the establishment of the named **Linda and Les Eastep Financial Needs Assistance Fund** and the **Sam and Peggy Klein Fund**.

B'RIT YISRAEL SCHOOL - SPRINGFIELD BOARD OF JEWISH EDUCATION

B'rit Yisrael is the Hebrew and Religious School program for the Jewish Community of Springfield. It was founded in 1981 to meet the needs of both the temples. The Springfield Board of Jewish Education is an independent corporation. The board consists of three members of each temple and both the Rabbis. The Administrator is a non-voting member. Its fiscal year runs June 1 through May 31st.

In the current year our enrollment was approximately 20 students. We continued to hold Hebrew classes for 3rd through 6th grade twice a week, once on Wednesdays for an hour at Temple Israel and once on Sunday mornings for 45 minutes at Temple B'rith Sholom. Religious school was held at Temple B'rith Sholom from 10:15 to noon.

Elissa GoldbergBelle completed her 7th year as director in February of this year. Our Hebrew instructors included both the **Rabbis** and **Sharon Snyder**. Our religious school instructors consisted of both **Rabbis, Rae Lipsky** and **Elissa GoldbergBelle**. We are very thankful to our volunteers, **Julie Nathanson-Abrams, Sharon Star** and **Kimberly Douglas**, without whom we could not have accomplished all that we did and without whose creativity we would not have had the rich programs that we did. Our volunteers gave generously of their resources, time and creativity. Our bulletin boards, in the classroom wing of Temple B'rith Sholom, show how busy we were through the year. I would also like to thank **Barbara Seidman** for her gift of music. Barbara donated her time once a month to teach our students the joys of the Jewish holidays and of Judaism through song. We also thank the parents who have supported our efforts, sat security, car

pooled, and brought their children weekly. Without your commitment to a Jewish education for your children, we would have no reason to exist.

We want to thank the Springfield Jewish Federation for their contribution to our Hebrew and Religious School program and to both our temples for their continued financial and in-kind assistance. We also want to thank all of you who have sent a donation to our Friends of SBJE annual fundraiser. We truly appreciate your support and commitment to the educational process of our young people.

This year we divided into two divisions. The Lower Division, K-4, concentrated on the holidays and on Jewish values. The Upper Division, 5-8, did Torah studies the first half of the year and focused also on Jewish values the second half. Often we brought the two divisions together for cooking lessons and other hands-on activities and music. It is truly marvelous to see how we have been able to develop a community by changing our format as we initiated it in 2014. By bringing all the students together in shared learning, we have created a sense of unity to a level that I had not seen in the 5 previous years. Our concluding event of games and a pizza party was held on Sunday, May 1, 2016.

Rather than collect Keren Ami each week, we set up shoe boxes in both the Temples seeking donations of gently used shoes. These will be shipped to a Jewish organization that sends the shoes to partners in South America for resale by small entrepreneurs. The box at TBS has space for more, so please add your shoes to the box that is usually in the lobby. Thank you for your contributions.

We are looking forward to next year when we hope to repeat our courses on Comparative Religion and the Holocaust and we hope to have our 8th/9th grade trip to Chicago. We are in the process of laying out our structure for the new



year as we continue to adapt to our changing demographics.

It takes of lot people to run the school, to teach, to provide snacks, provide creative activities, administer and govern. Without parents, community, stakeholders, Rabbis, teachers and board members, we could not provide the high quality of education we currently enjoy. We look forward to your continued involvement and another great year.

Previously we had identified six areas where we could play a significant role in both developing relationships and educating our Jewish community, as well as the Greater Springfield community at large. These areas include: **Israel and the Mideast, Interfaith Outreach, Political Advocacy, Poverty and Hunger, Endangered Jewry worldwide, and Education Outreach within the Springfield and surrounding areas.** We have continued to focus on these areas.

As the Jewish community worldwide becomes smaller and more polarized, Israel becoming more isolated, and American society becoming more fractured, the building of relationships and providing of factual information to both our own constituency and opinion leaders becomes even more important. This was a particularly challenging year in this field. Our JCRC grappled with the Iran Agreement, having studied Iran and the nuclear issue for almost a decade. After fully hearing arguments in favor and in opposition, we chose to instead

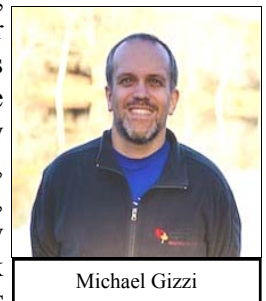
educate our community about the positives and the negatives of the agreement and encourage them to contact their individual representatives on the issue. I was truly proud of each of the members as they professionally discussed the issue with respect and civility.

Over the past year, we have sponsored a variety of presentations that were open to our community. In December, we welcomed Viva Sarah Press, who spoke on “Israeli Technology: How Israelis are predicting, creating and protecting the future.” Lonnie Nasatir, ADL’s Regional Director for Chicago and the Upper Midwest, spoke in January about the State of Anti-Semitism on college campuses, in social media and around the world. And most recently, Professor Michael Gizzi spoke to a group of 46 community members in April. Prof. Gizzi is active with Presbyterians for a Middle East Peace and shared with us “Israel through a Presbyterian lens.”

Prof. Gizzi has also been working with our Interfaith Committee in promoting interfaith dialogue between our community and the Great Rivers Presbytery. Together we are co-sponsoring an exciting 2 day event bringing Dr. Amy Jill Levine, a Professor at Vanderbilt University, who is an authority in New Testament and Jewish Studies. Look for more upcoming details on this August 24th event.

We had hoped to sponsor an annual Holocaust workshop for our teachers within the Springfield area after our successful one last year. When scheduling, we took into account football season, but unfortunately not football playoffs and we had to postpone the workshop. We are looking for the best times and structure for our workshop that will meet the needs of our teachers and plan to offer one next year.

Our political advocacy committee arranged a meeting with both Republican and Democratic candidates for Congress in the fall. In attendance were both the JCRC and Federation boards, as well as our local Presidents of the Jewish organizations. It was an



interesting interchange of ideas on a variety of subjects of interest to our Jewish community. In addition, our JCRC and Federation boards met jointly with Senator Durbin in November to discuss our community issues and concerns. We intend to meet with newly elected Rep. Darrin LaHood in the near future.

Lastly our very successful, JCRC Mitzvah Mobile Food Pantry will be held on May 14th. Last May, we served 157 families and individuals and distributed over 17,000 lbs. of fresh food. It was a remarkable experience, not only for those who received

food but also for our 60 cross-generational volunteers who participated. We thank the Jewish Federation for being the primary funder of this project as well as all of our member organizations for their monetary participation.

It has been my privilege and pleasure to serve as JCRC Chair for the past two years. We can continue to make a significant difference in the area of community relations with your help.

SENIOR PROGRAMS

Senior Services at the Jewish Federation of Springfield consists of three separate but overlapping programs: **Chaverim, Knosh & Knowledge**, and **Senior Packages/Visits**. The needs and expectations of seniors in the Springfield Jewish community have changed in the last twenty years, just as they have in the population at large.

CHAVERIM: After 30 years as a kosher luncheon program, *Chaverim* was re-constituted in 2015 as a late morning social hour. The inaugural year of the *Chaverim* program focused on providing holiday-themed celebrations, held approximately once a month. We began with *Yom Ha'atzmaut* (Israel Independence Day) in April 2015, followed by *Shavuot, Tu B'Av, Rosh Hashana, Sukkot, Chanukah, Tu B'Shvat, Purim, Pesach*, and ended with *Yom Ha'atzmaut* again earlier this month. Our November program coincided with campaign season, so the program included a discussion of the role and relevance of the Jewish Federation in Jewish lives locally and abroad. Although no longer a meal program, *Chaverim* includes refreshments themed to the holiday being celebrated (for *Our Federation* we featured chocolate). Program attendance varies due to weather and individual health, but is similar to what was seen in recent years.

Has this new Chaverim concept been successful? To answer this question, we asked *Chaverim* participants to give us feedback. They reported that they liked the continuation of the social aspect of the program and asked for an educational component as well, so they could learn more about the various holidays. The Senior Committee, under the direction of **Arden Lang**, met in December 2015 to review the first six months and to plan for the future. A full slate of 2016 programs was scheduled and will be re-assessed later in the year. We began implementing the educational concept under the leadership of both Rabbis with a January 2016 Tu B'Shvat seder. A dedicated corps of volunteers prepare refreshments, make phone calls, and provide transportation. **Mark Deluhery** prepares a delicious central food item that serves as a healthy mid-morning snack.

KNOSH & KNOWLEDGE continues as an educational program for active retirees, although there is definitely overlap in the two groups. Programs this past year included speakers from CWLP's Energy Audit Division, UIS Athletics, the Illinois Innocence Project, Wm. Vann's Coffee, and FitClub, as well as speakers on healthy eating and keeping your heart healthy. A master list of topics, field trips, and activities was developed with the help of active members, **Eydee Schultz** and **Terri Benson**, and should keep the group busy for some time. Events are held in offsite settings as much as possible and new venues for the more didactic sessions are being tried.



SENIOR PACKAGES/VISITS is the third component of the Senior Service Programs. A relatively stable cadre of volunteers deliver packages to approximately 30 area seniors at Rosh Hashanah, Chanukah and Passover. We try to maintain continuity in the volunteer-senior pairings. In addition, we partnered with the B’rit Yisrael Religious School this year to deliver Purim Shalach Manot packages that the school children prepared for them.

We are contemplating additional strategies to help serve our Jewish seniors and the Senior Committee will continue to meet to help further the goals of the new Chaverim that was envisioned last year.

CHAI TEA: The Chai Tea is an annual fundraiser held to support our Senior Social Service programs. The 2016 Chai Tea was held on February 21 in the Social Hall at Temple B’rith Sholom. **Anita Myers** and **Mark Deluhery** served as onsite chefs and guest chefs from local restaurants and caterers provided an ambitious menu to an appreciative crowd of more than 125 guests. New this year was a Gala Parade of Hats Contest that included more than a dozen contestants. We welcomed student athletes from the UIS cheerleading team and the men’s basketball team as our wait staff. Many local businesses help sponsor the event or supported our charity raffle.



CARDOZO SOCIETY

The Cardozo Society was created for the purpose of bringing together Jewish legal professionals for education and fellowship. The Society is for attorneys, judges and law students in the Springfield and surrounding Jewish communities, and is named after Benjamin Nathan Cardozo, a distinguished attorney and U.S. Supreme Court Justice, who was shaped by his Sephardic heritage.

The Cardozo Society has been busy planning a major community-wide event for June 2016.

The **Education and Culture Committee** provides activities and programs to appeal to a wide range of ages and interests, and is funded by an annual allocation from the Federation and by income generated by the **Jim and Edith Myers Adult Education Legacy Fund** and the **Mogerman Family Fund**.

In June 2015, the four-film **Jewish Film Series** took place on four consecutive Sunday afternoons at Temple B'rith Sholom's Vestry Room. We presented two documentaries (**Deli Man** and **No Place on Earth**), a Comedy-Drama (**Mr. Kaplan**), and a thriller (**The Art Dealer**). The committee has worked hard this winter to present another fine set of films for the community this June, but this year on Thursday evenings and at a new location (with a larger screen), Capital City Bar & Grill.

Other programs in the past year included the *Lincoln and the Jews* series of exhibits and presentations, organized in conjunction with the *Shapell Manuscript Foundation* and in partnership with the *Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum*.

The committee has several new and exciting programs in the planning stages for later in 2016.



SOCIAL SERVICES

Sari Miller Wancket.....Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor

We provide a range of private, confidential services to individuals and families in our community to assist in assessing difficult life situations and helping to formulate a plan of intervention. Crisis intervention, case management and supportive counseling, as well as liaison work with other community resources and service providers, are all core aspects of our work.

PJ LIBRARY

Nine years ago, the Jewish Federation began providing families of young children free Jewish books and CD's through the PJ Library. PJ Library, which now reaches five countries including Israel, and is available in three languages, is a Jewish family engagement program implemented at the local level throughout North America via the Harold Grinspoon Foundation and made possible in our community by the **Neal J. Feldman Fund**.



The program was first brought to Springfield by Gail Lieberman. Gail, Kari Horowitz, and Bill and Lindy Seltzer were early sponsors of the program. We are grateful to Beryl and Howard Feldman for committing funds from the **Neal J. Feldman Fund** to continue supporting this enrichment program for our area children.

More than 125,000 children and families receive PJ Library books throughout North America. Every month, member families with children ages 6 months through 8 years, receive a new package in the mail. Children learn about the Jewish holidays and customs, the Hebrew language, Israel, the culture of American Jews and more. Statistics show that 58% say that PJ Library influences their decision to build upon or add a Jewish tradition to their home. This is a great way to teach young children about their own Judaism and help them feel connected to Jews throughout the world.

Approximately 15 children in our area receive this benefit. When the Federation learns of a new birth of one of its members, we add that child to the program. After one year in the program, parents who are members of Federation are asked to renew enrollment, but are not charged for membership, thanks to the generous patronage by the **Neal J. Feldman Fund**. Grandparents can also enroll grandchildren in the program, wherever they live, at their own expense.

In October 2015, the **Neal J. Feldman Fund**, under the auspices of the **PJ Library Program**, and Temple Israel Sisterhood co-sponsored an interactive *Shadow Puppet Workshop* with California artist and musician, **Daniel Barash**.





The Jewish Federation of North America and Harold Grinspoon Foundation (HGF) selected the Jewish Federation of Springfield to participate in their LIFE & LEGACY™ program. Our Federation applied for the program in December 2015 and was one of eight Small Federated Jewish communities chosen. The purposes of this two-year program are to establish a culture of legacy giving in Springfield and to work with our partners, Temple B’rith Sholom and Temple Israel, to secure a Jewish future for our community.

Our application for this grant program noted:

While we are a smaller community, our community members know each other, care deeply about their Jewish Springfield and are concerned about preserving a Jewish future in Springfield. Each organization is excited about the possibility and has a history of achieving goals. Participation in LIFE & LEGACY has the potential to mesh with other community efforts to create a long term plan for our Jewish future in Springfield and maximize its impact. The LIFE & LEGACY grant is an opportunity for us to work together, combine our talents, enhance trust and dedicate our collective efforts to a goal that benefits our entire Jewish community.

The LIFE & LEGACY goals are to:

- Educate, train, motivate and empower Jewish organizations to engage their loyal stakeholders in conversations to establish legacy gifts
- Increase community awareness of the power of bequests, other legacy vehicles and endowments
- Integrate legacy giving into the philanthropic culture of the Jewish community.

Nancy Sage participated in a LIFE & LEGACY “train the trainer” program for small federation executives in February. Since then the Federation and temples have established legacy teams, attended two LIFE & LEGACY training sessions, and submitted management plans to HGF. Soon we will begin our legacy conversations with community members

LIFE & LEGACY is the newest initiative of the HGF, the visionaries behind the PJ Library and JCAMP 180 programs. HGF has committed \$30 million dollars over the next ten years to engage communities in legacy building efforts to secure the future of vibrant Jewish communities. We are honored to be part of this program.

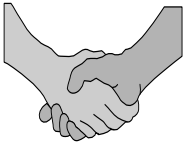
